



- Economic development agency
- Partnership of federal government and 13 state governments
- Mission: Strengthen economic growth and community capacity in Appalachia

Grants for READY Non-Profit Participants:

- Up to \$25,000, no match required
- Must address their organization's capacity building
- We help nonprofit develop their idea
- Not competitive
- Does not have to relate to their course



We follow this basic program model for LDDs, Local Governments, and Community Foundations.







READY LDDs

- Currently <u>OPEN</u>
- Specifically for Local Development Districts
- EPA is contributing funding
- Up to \$100,000 available for participating LDDs
- Hiring staff/contractors to help communities apply for and manage federal funds




